

Think you're too young to get screened?

Think again! Since colon cancer is on the rise in men and women under 50, 45 is the recommended age to begin screening for adults at average risk for colon cancer. Talk to your healthcare provider about your risk for colon cancer and when to start screening.

Coverage

Talk to your insurance company about whether they pay the cost of screening and if that could change based on what's found during the test. This can help you avoid surprise costs.



Colonoscopy vs. Stool Tests

Not all colon cancer screening options are created equal.

While at-home stool tests can detect signs of cancer, they don't prevent it or remove dangerous polyps. Colonoscopy is the only test that both detects and treats threats of colon cancer in one procedure.

FEATURES	COLONOSCOPY	STOOL TEST
Screens for colon cancer	✓	✓
Polyps removed	✓	×
Expert examination of colon	✓	×
Rate of detecting small, precancerous polyps	75%-93%	42%
Frequency, if normal	Every 10 years	Every 1-3 years

Quick Hint: Start with a Colonoscopy

Colonoscopy is the most reliable way to detect and prevent colorectal cancer.

- Enables the surgeon to examine the entire colon
- Detects and treats polyps in one procedure
- Prevents cancer by removing polyps early
- Many insurance plans cover the costs of a colonoscopy as a screening test, but call your insurer if you have a question or aren't sure about something.

Stool-Based Tests May Cost You More

- If a stool-based test is positive, then a follow-on colonoscopy is required.
- A follow-on colonoscopy is categorized as diagnostic (no longer a screening test) by many insurance plans.
- Diagnostic colonoscopies are typically not fully covered by many insurance plans and may be subject to co-pays and deductibles.



Roughly 1-in-10 stool-based tests return false-positive results, which may result in a follow-on colonoscopy.
